This week in reading, we will be finishing up on our figurative language practice. We will focus on similes, metaphors, hyperbole, onomatopoeia, alliteration, and idioms. Students have been practicing a reading skill called UNRAAVEL. For the next two weeks, you will see about 2-3 reading passages come home that your child needs to UNRAAVEL. Please take the time to sit down with your child to work through each passage. They have been instructed to get these signed or initialed and to return them the next day. Your student will HIGHLY benefit from your guidance and support. The OCCT Reading Test has been bumped up to April **4th and 5th**.
